Blackjack Switch – The New Face Of Blackjack

An ideal and simple hassle free game that is played in casinos that has gained popularity with such speed is blackjack. The game needs a 52-card deck hand. Each player is given two cards, and the game aims at getting at the number 21 or a number that is close to it, but it should not go above it. So it is also known as 21. Different variants of [blackjack](#) are becoming increasingly popular and are here to stay.

Almost all casino games have variations, and blackjack also has a few. Blackjack switch is one of the variations. The game is played with two hands, and you can exchange the second card in the hands. This exchange can bring about fantastic turn-arounds in the fortunes of the players.

One of the more renowned variant of the blackjack is the Spanish 21. It is a very productive and taxing game. It resembles the Double Attack. You will need 6-8 decks of 48 cards to play the game. All the tens are detached from the deck but this loss is made up for by the different rules of the game. The rules allow you to double and then re double. Additionally, a lot of bonuses are issued. They are given to players who have a combination of five, six, seven cards. You also get a bonus if you have a combination of 6, 7, and 8, or if you have three 7's. The Ace is allowed to be re-split, and you can also make a late give in, etc. However, the most thrilling thing about it is that, if the player and the dealer have blackjacks then it is the player who will win the game. This version is known as "Pontoon" is Australia and is very well known for its liveness and low house edge.

A deck that has its tens removed is used in this version called the double attack blackjack. There will be six such decks. A lot of [casino bonus](#) schemes make up for the drawback, resulting from the loss of the tens. To demonstrate, when the dealer has opened up his face up card, the players can then bet that he will bust when he has just three cards, and if this does happen then the player becomes entitled to an extra bonus. The bonus is calculated according to the card that was drawn. For instance if the card drawn is a 6 then the payout will be 16:1. However, if the dealer has a 8 and the card drawn is a 8 the payout will be 50:1. When the number and suits match, the payout will be as high as 200:1.

The action in the Multiple Actions Blackjack lies in the betting. Here you can bet 2-3 times on every hand. Each bet entitles the dealer to a new hand. The dealer gets to play a lot of extra hands; this is not there in the other versions. The rule regarding the splitting and doubling is the same as in the standard version of blackjack.

The European Blackjack is played with just two decks that are shuffled before the start of a new game. The dealer gets an edge on all the hands valued at 17 and more. In addition, he hits on all hands of 16 or below. The player loses to the dealer's blackjack, even if you have a 21. You will be allowed to double only if you have split, and the doubling must be equal to your first bet.

The Caribbean 21 is a variation of blackjack that has a very low house edge. In this version, the player can split one of his first cards, and then he can hit and also double twice. The Ace is only valued at one. However, the best combination in the Caribbean 21 is an Ace with two cards that have the value ten. In the event of a tie, the dealer gets the advantage. Since there is a very low house edge it is preferred by most players.

There being so many variants of blackjack, you need not depend only on the traditional blackjack. Playing the different variants will give you enough experience to add on new strategies and this will help you to see extra strategies in the game.
