TruTV will broadcast a Wednesday doubleheader of Alabama State vs. Texas San Antonio at 6:35 PM ET came after by Virginia Commonwealth vs. USC at 9:05 PM ET.

The [sports book](#) opened up with Texas San Antonio as a 4.5 point favorite over Alabama State and with USC as a 4.5 point favorite over Virginia Commonwealth.

The Texas San Antonio Roadrunners were the victors of the Southland Conference Tournament and enter March Madness wager competition with an overall record of 19-13 straight up and 1-1 versus the spread as they're a team that is hardly ever on the board.

Alabama State was the champion of the Southwest Athletic Conference competition and is also a team that is seldom on the Sports-Gambling board. The Hornets ended with a record of 17-17 consecutive up and 4-1 versus the spread.

Southern California has shown noticeable improvement under 2nd year coach Kevin O'Neal as they're trying to rebuild following being slapped with NCAA probation for the OJ Mayo fiasco a few seasons ago. USC enters wager March Madness action with a record of 19-14 straight up and 15-13-4 vs the spread.

The Trojans are arriving from a 67-62 loss to Arizona as 1 point favorites in the Pac 10 Competition. O'Neal missed that game because of a bar room altercation with an Arizona enthusiast the evening before which got him a suspension from USC athletic director Pat Haden but he'll be back in good standing for this game.

USC is a very great defensive squad that allowed only 62.8 points per competition. Nikola Vucevic is an exceptional skill to watch on USC as he headed the Men of Troy with 17.3 points and 10.2 rebounds per match.

Virginia Commonwealth had a record of 23-11 consecutive up and only 13-20 against the spread. The enter March Madness wagering action as the runner up in the Colonial Athletic Association Competition following losing that league's championship match to Old Dominion 70-65 as 4.5 point dogs.

VCU was a dubious selection for the Big Dance as plenty of experts thought Virginia Tech was more worthy.

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
