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The Minnesota Timberwolves won only 15 competitions last year and they also struggled against [pro basketball betting](#) online point spread. It might not be much better in 2010-2011 as the Minnesota Timberwolves still lack expertise however they do have a few young players who may impact [pro basketball gambling](#) line as the season progresses.

The Timberwolves have not been to the playoffs since the 2003 season, which was easily their most productive year in franchise history. They were Midwest Division champions however they lost the NBA Finals to the Lakers. It is most likely the closest the Timberwolves will come to that title for a long time, since their record has gone continuously downhill since that time. The most recent time the team posted a winning year was the 2004 year. In their 21 seasons since the team was founded in 1989, they've merely had 8 winning seasons, and all of those were with Flip Saunders as head coach. Since he was fired in the course of the 2004 year, the squad has been through 4 head coaches, and none have managed to come close to the achievement of 2003.

Last Season's Record 15-67 SU, 37-44-1 ATS - The Minnesota Timberwolves weren't a quality team last season. They won just 15 matches straight up and only 37 against the spread at the [sports book](#). Minnesota basically did not have enough scoring to win persistently. It could be the same thing this season. The Minnesota Timberwolves are relying on lots of young competitors and that means inconsistent scoring.

Prediction - It will be intriguing to see Wesley Johnson in his rookie season though apart from that, there isn't much to like about Minnesota in NBA wagering. The squad is intending that Darko Milicic will turn into a player. Keep hoping Minnesota because it is not going to happen. The Timberwolves are flinging millions away on Milicic which indicates how mismanaged this squad is. Michael Beasley is a solid player that will put up statistics but Miami didn't think enough of him to retain him so you have to question his character and there are queries about his work ethic. Jonny Flynn competed well sometimes last year as he averaged 13.5 points and 4.4 assists per match. Flynn is not a star guard however and he can't carry a squad. Corey Brewer is a nice part competitor as is Luke Ridnour. Gaining Martell Webster could possibly be a quality move also. The Timberwolves are ready for huge things from Kevin Love but he is not a great scorer. He averaged 14 points per competition last year but he did pull down 11 rebounds per game. Minnesota performs in a difficult division and they are not destined to be aggressive on most nights even though they may cover pro basketball wagering online number on occasion. They hope to build for the future with their youthful competitors and give supporters a reason to hope for the long run.

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
