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# Part Two Of NFL Road Game Bets

It takes a lot to win on the road in pro football, but there are four teams that possess the elements necessary to pull off the difficult task in Week 10. These 4 are in a distinctive position to get a difficult road win based on trends, past history and encompassing circumstances coming into this weekend's competition.

Detroit at Bills - Drew Bledsoe passed for 302 yards and a touchdown to provide the Bills a 24-17 victory in Week 8 of the 2002 season.

Why they're looking great on the road this weekend - The Lions have lost 24 sequential games on the road. That extraordinary skid has to stop at some point, right? This may be Detroit's greatest opportunity over that whole span to finally send an rival crowd out of the stadium with a frown. They have a robust defensive front that ought to control the line of scrimmage and slow down the Bills' offense, and they've got enough power to take advantage of Buffalo's 26th-ranked defense in [NFL Football Gambling](#).

The Bills are the league's only winless squad to date this year at 0-8. Lines are they will get a victory at some point in 2010 (the Lions are the only 0-16 team in league history), but this might not be that week. They've come their nearest to winning on the road in [free online betting](#), losing close overtime games at Baltimore and Kansas City, whereas struggling down the stretch at New England Patriots. The stress to win in front of the home devotees might be excessive for the Buffalo Bills to bear.

Eagles versus Redskins - DeSean Jackson had 136 yards from scrimmage and two tds to lead the Philadelphia Eagles past the Washington Redskins, 27-17, in Week 7 of last year.

Why they're looking great on the road this season - Michael Vick has returned, and that's great news for the Eagles. In the three games in which he has played from start to finish, Philadelphia is 3-0 and has averaged 29.6 points. When the Eagles lost to the Redskins earlier this year in Philadelphia, Vick was taken out in the 1st half and the Philadelphia Eagles were kept to just 12 points. With Vick, the Philadelphia Eagles will likely get into the end zone a great deal more frequently.

At 4-4, the Washington Redskins still control their own fate in the NFC East race. For a squad with such opportunities, nonetheless, the feeling is one of frustration. Mike Shanahan's decision to take out Donovan McNabb for the final two minutes in a loss at Detroit has surrounded the team in crisis. The diversion created by that choice may very well be big enough that it will influence Washington in this emotional matchup versus McNabb's former squad.

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
