When the most recent and best model is declared, that club you had your eyes on now becomes overstocked inventory. It's possible to get it for a 3rd off, or if you can wait 2 months, you can get it for as much as 66% off.

If you don't mind used clubs, and while they're in good shape why would you, there are some absolute takes available. The cheapest place to get used clubs is at a yard sale. True story. I got a hardly used Callaway Gigantic Bertha II with head cover for \$10 at a yard sale. Why the low price? Because I bought it from the better half. The partner was out golfing and left the sale to his partner.

Yes this takes some time but there are real diamonds in the coarse to be found if you're employed at it. Test your local paper or online classifieds like Craig's list for times and locations.

Another reliable source for used clubs can be discovered online at the bigger club manufacturer and retail sites. Makers will have "demo" clubs for sale and the retail sites regularly take trade-ins when they sell new clubs. These sites are sometimes a source of wonderful buys and have the added value of coming with customer service which naturally the yard sale doesn't.

Don't thumb your nose at the large box stores. You will not find top of the line clubs there but often time's you'll find lower end clubs that are either unique (like my \$40 Dunlop nine wood from Target that I wouldn't sell for \$400) or merely unbelievably priced.

If you know exactly what you need and you have got some patience, it is possible to get a heck of a deal on men's golfing clubs.
