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Basketball History: Precisely How The Game Started

It all started having a child's game that the inventor, Dr. James Naismith employed to play outside his schoolhouse when he was younger. This game was referred to as duck-on-a-rock, it aimed to knock the duck off the rock by tossing another rock against it.

This then gave Dr. Naismith a concept of a game which he introduced for the college students of YMCA Training School in 1891. Because of the cold climate, the trainees of the School for Christian Employees necessary a game that may very well be played indoors and one that wouldn't use much strength. He then conceptualized a ball game that employs two baskets as goals with each teams competing for that most number of shots.

Apart from the game itself, he also outlined the first 13 guidelines on playing the game which covers the recommendations, distinction of violations and fouls, plus the roles of each umpires and referees, which include the duration of every game.

Hence, these events led for the real birth of the game in December 21, 1881 when it was initial played right after Dr. Luther Gulick, the head of physical schooling on the YMCA, gave a two-week allowance for his employee to make a new game.

While the game would be developed within the following years, the college students of the YMCA Training School loved it initially. It was even said that Dr. Naismith had a tricky time convincing his college students to leave the game right after every session. [Jump Higher](#)

The game went on to be played within the Olympics in Berlin, Germany where the USA Team beat the Canadian group having a score of 19-8. At this time, there had been 22 nations that joined the competitors. By 1976, Women's Basketball was introduced in to the Olympics.

But prior to that had been the creations of National Basketball League (NBL) in 1937 and Basketball Association of America (BAA) in 1946. The very first women's collegiate basketball was splayed on April 4, 1896 in San Francisco's Page Street Armory where Cal and Stanford met. Contrary to the physical and strenuous game we now see in WNBA, the ladies basketball teams back in 1896 retained their ladylike method within the game and guidelines had been even modified to accommodate this organic tendency. Stanford then won having a 2-1 score against Cal group.

These events led for the popularity of basketball in our time.

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
