# **How a Golf Range Finder Can Help You Towards Lower Handicap**

Let me tell you a little **secret** that will take any average golfer and improve their game right away. We are talking about a simple manner to amend your game not a secret formula for success that will change you into a professional golfer. I am just talking about the simple yet effective [golf rangefinder](#) that most professional golfers use nowadays. It takes moments to use and the first thing you notice is how the chance is minimized when you take your shot. If you do not know what a golf range finder is then do not worry because I will explain. A golf range finder is a gadget that tells you the length to various objects on the course. Different types of rangefinder will have different features but the basic concept is simple, to encounter a length to an object. The purpose is to encounter the green or to avoid traps. This can help you decide on what club to use. Now that the guesswork is taken out of the game you can just memorize how far you can hit the ball with each of your clubs.

Here is a little list of how neat a golf range finder is:

- **Gives You Increased Confidence in Your Golf**
- **Allows You to Pick the right Golf club**
- **Helps You Find the Flag**
- **Helps You Find the Green**

As this list shows, there is no limit to the benefits of using a **golf range finder**. Of all the different types and brands of golf range finders that you can choose from there are just three types those are separated into.

The simple optical range finder is the first one. It uses a simple line that the user aligns vertically against the object to get the reading. The GPS comes second and you load a map of the course you are playing into the gadget that then uses the map and your placement to encounter the length to various objects. Then we have the most popular and the most accurate of the three which is a laser range finder that utilizes a laser that bounces off objects to get a reading of the length to that object.

If you are not using one already you should encounter the *golf range finder* that will improve your golf today. You can choose from many different types of **golf rangefinder**, such as laser and GPS, from many different producers. You will encounter that there are many different types and brands on the market.

GPS, laser, or optical is your choice to make. The cheapest option is the optical but it is the least accurate. The [Bushnell Tour V2 Rangefinder](#) is a beneficial example of a laser rangefinder that is accurate but will not cost you as much as some other products out there. A laser range finder is limited to a straight line to the object at hand whilst GPS range finders are not. It comes down to personal preference if you want to go for price, accuracy or flexibility.
