# **Lee Chong Wei Is Certainly Malaysian Badminton Champion**

Lee's very first major title was in 2003 at the Malaysia Open despite the fact that he started his qualified profession in 2002.

The very next year, he was able to acquire extra titles winning the Malaysia Open again and also the Chinese Taipei Open. Given that then the seasoned Lee Chong Wei was able to win many titles, having six Malaysian titles out of seven finals contested and winning quite a few Super Series titles. Given that in August 2008 he was ranked number one higher than the excellent [Lin Dan](#) on the subject of badminton. He was at the top of his badminton profession and definitely still on the lookout for more great achievement.

Although he won quite a few trophies, which includes a bronze medal within the BWF World Championship of 2005, his biggest achievement need to undoubtedly be the silver medal won at the 2008 Summer Olympics. He was a national hero that day, simply because he won not only he was the initial Malaysian to reach a final, he also won a medal at the Olympics for Malaysia, so ending Malaysia Olympic medal drought that dated since 1996.
