# Ping i15 Driver Review

If you've read any of my [golf clubs review](#) before, then you already know that I really like Ping. They are strong contenders from the Driver category as well as anything in golf. Ping is probably the top 5 that you'd think of for equipment. In that [Ping I15 Driver Review](#) we let loose to get intimate with this energy driver.

The fade structured design of Ping i15 Driver is directed towards all those golfers who put the emphasis on working all those tee shots. The head is made of 460cc titanium and the engineers achieved a pear shaped head with the bulging crown design to optimize energy transfer to give you top speed and a deep, strong feel.

If you make the roll along with a tighter bulge, it gives the driver internal weighting which often, will reduce ball spin, promoting a more expedient preferred ball trajectory.

The club is a deep rich charcoal color and would look good in any golf tote. It really does have a beautiful design that all your golfing buddies would be envious of. If you help to increase the way the club hits, then you will observe how it will be the most talked about club from the clubhouse.

Here is a reputable review from an fervent golfer:

"I have been playing a G10 for two years and have always been a good driver of the golf ball until lately when my misses were low hooks. It's been so bad I always have pretty much began using my 3 real wood on Driver holes from my home course. I hit the I15 in a demo day a couple weeks ago at my membership and liked what I saw and when I saw the latest price drop I thought I had to buy it. It took me about 15 balls on the range to get the feel and we were able to hit the slight fade or the slight draw with minimal adjustments. Took it out yesterday to get a quick 9 after function and hit 4 of 5 fairways on the back tees. I haven't noticed a distance gain but I had confidence that I knew where the ball was going.

This driver isn't for everyone. If you happen to be a good ball striker and struggle using a hook, you should try it out. "
