The Titleist Golf Company was founded by Phillip Young. He used to own and ran a rubber company but chosen an alternative industry as the rubber market went down. He had been a frustrated golfer who wanted to x-ray a golf ball at some point to discover what was going on inside and why they wouldn't fly straight.

He found many balls off-centre and considered it as a great opportunity to provide a much better golf ball that would travel straight. He produced a ball that really went straight by the early thirties. He made a ball that had spun rubber covering a solid center.

An improved ball was designed following the war and was the most played ball in the US open. The company quickly grew and purchased other golf manufacturers in the 1960s and 70s. They started to make clubs and other gear as well.

In 1985 the company bought the biggest name Foot-Joy. It was the very best recognized golf footwear worldwide. Although Titleist is known for various golf gear products, they are best known for their golf balls.

The balata ball was their biggest wonderful breakthrough in the 1980s. It provided golf players a soft feel and control. The downside of it was that it gets split and are damaged easily. They resolved this with their [Titleist Golf Balls](#). It was a pro ball that had balata inside but had a tough cover. It was very expensive but very popular.

Whilst other companies followed their brand, they began designing their most famous ball, The Titleist Pro V1. It is a favourite among newbees and gurus alike; many of them even agree that [Titleist Golf Balls](#) are the very best, however different and unique their own games may be. Knowing what type of swing you have is the starting point in identifying which ball is best suited for your game.

Local golf retailers usually have apparatus to examine your swing free of charge. After learning your sort of swing and club head speed, determine if you prefer balls having a better spin capacity, long distance, much softer feel, or increased accuracy.

The Titleist Pro V1 is what they call their "expert" ball. That explains its price at \$44/dozen. It is a popular option in the PGA Tour.

The Titleist Pro V1 is a 3-piece ball. It is excellent in spin capability, driver distance, has a soft feel, and driver accuracy. If you're a golf player having a slow head speed, you may want to make use of the 2 piece Titleist DT So-Lo.
