Gleneagles: is a long-time favourite among golf lovers. Designed by golf legend Jack Nicklaus, it is home to the PGA Centenary golf course and to the Ryder Cup Championships (2014). At 7081 yards, Gleneagles can be tough for some golfers as it demands accuracy. The course skews away from the many ponds, streams, pot bunkers, and sand traps.

Muirfield: will challenge any golfer in almost every aspect. Nicklaus was also among the winners here. The oldest golf club in the world - the Honourable Company of Edinburgh Golfer (1744) - is based on Muirfield. Among the golf courses in the British Isles and in Scotland, Muirfield is considered the finest. You will certainly remember Muirfield as a course steep in history and overflowing with challenges.

Royal Troon Golf Club boasts its own share of golf winners, from Bobby Locke to Justin Leonard. Wind is said to be the defining factor here, as it can ruin a golfer's plans.

Turnberry: is acknowledged as the most picture-perfect among the many golf stops in Scotland. The match between Nicklaus and Watson in 1977 was held here. If you love scenery and appreciate golf history, Turnberry is for you.
